A frequent recurrence to fundamental principles is essential to the security of individual rights and the perpetuity of free government. Sec. 2. All political power is inherent in the people, and governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed, and are established to protect and maintain individual rights. Sec. 3. The Constitution of the United States is the supreme law of the land. Sec. 4. No person shall be deprived of life, liberty, or property without due process of law. Sec. 5. The right of petition, and of the people peaceably to assemble for the common good, shall never be abridged. Sec. 6. Every person may freely speak, write, and publish on all subjects, being responsible for the abuse of that right. Sec. 7. The mode of administering an oath, or affirmation, shall be such as shall be most consistent with and binding upon...
